What Happens When We Pray?

Throughout the history of Samaritan Village one thing has been foremost on the hearts and minds of



everyone involved in the ministry of the orphanage—the belief that we will accomplish nothing unless we PRAY about everything. And then, when we have prayed, we pray some more, and ask others to pray and then pray some more. . .

Even in our sponsorship program, we believe that the most important role a sponsor has is to pray for the child they are sponsoring.

And what we have discovered from making prayer our number one priority at Samaritan Village is this: GOD ANSWERS PRAYER!

In the last two newsletters we decided to include areas where we can **all** join together to **pray** for the needs of Samaritan Village. These are the **prayer requests** from last month's newsletter and what happened when we all **prayed**.

Maasai Girls Future

We asked for God's will to be done in the lives of the Maasai girls; that they could remain at the orphanage. After hearing the case, the judge found four persons involved with the fake "orphanage" guilty, even sentencing one man to life in prison for what was done to the girls. The judge also gave full custody of the girls to Samaritan Village with the stipulation that we would be responsible for their complete care.

Urgent Prayer Request for Sinyath

We asked for prayer for Sinyath, one of the Maasai girls. The doctors had diagnosed her with kidney cancer and she was in the hospital. The doctors said the cancer had spread to other parts of her body, including her lungs. Sinyath has since been miraculously released from the hospital and is now back at the orphanage.

The Licensing of the Medical Clinic

We asked for prayer that we would find favor with the government officials for the licensing of the new medical clinic. We just received word from the government that our license has been approved.

To Tanzania with Love


We asked for prayer for this year's 25th anniversary celebration, To Tanzania with Love. It was an incredible event! We raised nearly \$15,000!

The staff and children at Samaritan Village will again be hosting a tremendous celebration at the orphanage on Christmas Day. Josephat expects close to 1,000 people will attend this year's event. There will be guests from the community as well as

away the sins of the world through His death burial and resurrection!
