This New Little Girl Would Love a Sponsor

A new little girl was brought to the orphanage in April. Like all the children at Samaritan Village, this little girl was found after being abandoned. Social Welfare always attempts to find the parents or at least relatives of abandoned children, but when they are unable to



locate anyone, they are turned over to an orphanage.

It has been a blessing these last several years as we have been able to expand the facilities and staff at Samaritan Village so we no longer have to turn away children due to a lack of room at the orphanage. We are close to being in a position to take in close to a hundred children. Please be in prayer as we raise the funds to build the required bridge from the main orphanage compound to the new medical building so the top two floors can be used for children.

Two Children Receive Medical Treatment

Josephat would like to thank those who gave financial and prayer support for the medical procedures that were done on Joash and Brighton.

The children were checked by specialist doctors. They said that Baby Brighton needed a small operation to insert tubes in his ears to remove water and improve his hearing. Joash was having sinus problems. After an X-ray the doctor decided on a minor operation. Doctors did the operations in a little less than three hours. Both children are doing well.

Sad News

We just received word that little Sinyath has lost her battle with kidney cancer. She was just seven years old. Sinyath was one of the Maasai girls that was brought to Samaritan Village last year after their orphanage was closed. You may remember a few months ago we asked for prayer when she was diagnosed with terminal cancer. At one time she had entered the hospital and was not expected to leave, but after a great deal of prayer, she was able to return to the orphanage. She spent her last few months there with her friends and then went to stay with her family in the Maasai village until she passed away. Sinyath was a wonderful little girl and thankfully her life hasn't ended because she met her Savior at Samaritan Village and now her life is with Jesus. And someday, we'll all have a chance to meet her.



In other sad news, a little baby who had been found abandoned in a ditch outside Arusha was scheduled to be brought to the orphanage but died before leaving the hospital. We sometimes forget how great the need is for the work being done at Samaritan Village as we reach out to rescue abandoned children. Unfortunately, the work can be heart-wrenching when we realize we can't save every baby.
